

At our school, 'Move Safely' means:

No hurting other children at all. This means keep your hands and feet to yourself.

No punching, pushing, pinching, kicking, pulling, biting, spitting or scratching.

Use toilets safely and hygienically.

No touching school equipment that could hurt you or anyone else e.g. fire extinguishers, electrical cords, power points and outlets.

Walk sensibly inside. No pushing in front of other people.

Sit safely on seats.

Enter and exit your classroom from the external classroom door at home time and when the bell rings.

Line up the way your teacher tells you to, and walk sensibly in the line when you are moving around the school.

Stay inside the school fences. Stay with your class and teacher during lessons.

Food should be eaten only in classrooms or eating areas.

If you spill something that others might slip on, clean it up straight away.

Run on the grass, walk everywhere else.

At our school, 'Take turns to speak' means:

Put your hand up to speak in class. No calling out. Listen when others are speaking.

Wait for others to finish speaking without interrupting.

Always listen to your teacher. Pay attention to your teacher's signal to stop talking e.g. whistle, bell, 1/2/3 Look at Me, Clapping, song etc

Stop and listen when you hear the PA.

At our school, 'Help others to learn means:

Give others a chance to 'have-a-go'.

Let others listen to teacher instructions.

Work in a friendly way in groups.

Don't copy from other students.

No distracting other students from their work.

When it's time to work, talk only about the work.

Listen politely at story time.

When working in groups, share information and ideas.

Share the teacher's time fairly.

Share time on computers fairly.

Don't do things that make other students watch you or laugh at you instead of doing their work.

Be willing to show others how to do something.

At our school, 'Take care of belongings means:

- If you borrow anything from anyone, say their name and say 'Can I please borrow this?'
- If you want to use school equipment, ask a teacher first. Don't snatch from others.
- Do not ever use or take anyone's belongings without permission. Put your belongings away in your tub or on your peg. Make sure all your belongings have your name on them.
- Be careful with equipment so that it does not get broken or lost.
- If you find something that belongs to somebody else, give it back, ask the teacher to help you find out who it belongs to, or take it to Lost Property or the office.
- If you make a mess, clean it up yourself.
- Help clean up the classroom even if you didn't make the mess yourself.
- Keep the classrooms and toilets clean.
- Put your rubbish in the bin.
- Report vandalism to a teacher or another adult.
- Do not bring expensive toys, games, or jewellery to school.
- Take care of library books and take home books when you're at home. Return them when you're supposed to.
- Do not bring a mobile phone to school unless your parents have applied for an exemption from the principal. If you have permission to bring a mobile phone, hand it to the teacher at the start of the day and collect it at the end of the day.
- Be honest if you have lost or broken something.
- Chewing gum is not allowed because it makes a mess.
