

MPPS School Rules for Inside and Outside

1. Move safely.
2. Take turns to speak.
3. Be friendly and helpful.
4. Help others to learn.
5. Take care of all belongings.



Consequences If You Choose to Break The Rules (Inside)

- Step 1: Your teacher will tell you what rule you broke and write your name on the board.
- Step 2: X Your teacher will tell you what rule you broke this time and you will be moved to another area in the room.
- Step 3: XX Your teacher will tell you what rule you broke this time and you will do 10 minutes time out writing out the rule/s.
- Step 4: XXX You will be sent to your Area Coordinator and a note will go home to your parents.
- Step 5: XXXX You will be sent to the Principal or the Assistant Principal.

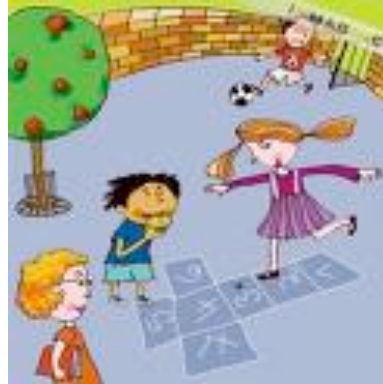
Specialists will send a note to your teacher telling them what rule you broke and how many crosses you have against your name.



Consequences if You Choose to Break the Rules (Outside)

If what you did is not too serious, the Yard Duty Teacher will write your name on the 'Playground Infringement Daily Sheet'. The teacher will ask you to explain what happened, give you a warning, and maybe ask witnesses about what happened too. Then you may have to:

- Clean up the yard.
- Walk with the teacher.
- Sit on the bench.
- Say you are sorry.
- Be banned from an area or game.
- Make up for what you did.



If your name comes up more than once a week you may have to see the Assistant Principal, and she will decide what happens next.

If what you did is serious (e.g. hurting other students, offensive behaviour, bullying, racism etc) the Yard Duty teacher will:

- Write out a Playground Report, which is given to your Area Coordinator. You will have to fill out a Learning From My Mistakes sheet.
- You will have to go to the Area Coordinator, and the Coordinator will ask you to explain what happened and talk about the rules with you. You will be removed from the yard for a set period of time. Your parents will get a Playground Report about what happened, they will sign it, and then you have to bring it back to school next day.

If what you did is very serious (e.g. violence), the Yard Duty teacher will immediately send you to the Assistant Principal/Principal and they will decide what should happen next. Your parents will be told about what happened. You can also be suspended or expelled.
